CLASSROOM PLACEMENT CONSIDERATIONS

If you wish to fill out a form to communicate information about your child to be considered when class lists are made, please stop in the office. We strive to ensure that all students and staff are operating in an environment to foster and support learning. Balancing out the academic, behavior and social needs in the classrooms is a high priority for us to ensure this happens. Procedures are as follows:

- We will not accept specific teachers as requests
- A form is available in the office to document what type of learning environment you feel your child is most successful in, special needs, academic concerns, etc.
- These forms can be picked up and turned in to the office. All forms need to be turned in by Thursday, April 14th.



Cell Phones

We have been having lots of cell phones being used at school. Below is from the Elementary Handbook (pg. 22)

Cell Phones At School: Students bringing cell phones to school must:

- 1. Turn cell phones off when arriving on school grounds.
- 2. Cell phones must remain off until off school grounds.
- 3. Cell phones must be placed in the student lockers (grades 3-5).

4. Students without lockers should check the cell phones into the office or in with their teacher. (K-2)

5. Students needing to use their cell phones between 7:30am and 4pm may be granted permission by the office.

Students violating the above procedure will be required to turn the cell phones into the office.

First violation - Parent notification and the student may pick up the phone at the end of the day.
 Second violation - Parent notification and parents will be required to pick up the phone from the office.

3. Third violation - Parent notification and parents will be required to pick up the phone from the office. The student will not be allowed to bring the phone to school.


A WB parent shared with me that Eeros, an amazon device used with Mediacom internet, has been a terrific tool for monitoring internet usage at home. In addition, with the click of a button on the smartphone app, she can block access to any or all devices in their home. I purchased the equipment to replace my aging Securely equipment and, while more expensive, it is a much easier program to use. Parents can set time limits on specific devices including gaming consoles and tablets. The smartphone interface is intuitive and user friendly and installation took about 15 minutes.

Bullying: Know the facts

Teaching your child about bullying can help her handle it better if she sees it and also make her less likely to bully others. Share these facts.



Verbal bullying is more common. Teasing and threatening happen more often than physical bullying like hitting or shoving. If your child is bullied verbally or physically, she should tell a grown-up right away.

Bystanders make a difference. Studies show that more than half of bullying incidents stop when a bystander steps in. Have your youngster think of things she could say if a classmate is being bullied. ("Want to play with me?" "Let's go sit over here.")

Excluding others can be bullying, too. When a child urges other kids not to be friends with someone, that's bullying. Encourage your youngster to be kind to everyone and not to exclude others. She might say something like, "I decide who I'm friends with."
